## Chapter 6

Likewife children and parents he exhorteth, 5. item feruants and maifters. 10. Then that al take courage in the might of God, but fo, that withal they arme themfelues (confidering what mightie enemies they haue) with al peeces of fpiritual armour, 18. praying alwaies feruently, and for him alfo.

Col. 3, 20. Exo. 20, 12. Deut. 5, 6. hildren, obey your parents in our Lord. For this is iuft. <sup>2</sup> Honour thy father & thy mother (which is the firft comandment in the promife) <sup>3</sup> that it may be vvel with thee & thou maieft be longlived vpon the earth. <sup>4</sup> And you fathers, provoke not your children to anger: but bring them vp in the difcipline & correption of our Lord.

<sup>5</sup> Seruants, be obedient to your Lords according to Col. 3, 22. Tit. 2, 9. the flefh, with feare and trembling, in the fimplicitie of 1. Pet. 2, 8. your hart as to Chrift: <sup>6</sup> not feruing to the eye, as it were pleafing men, but as the feruants of Chrift doing the wil of God from the hart, <sup>7</sup> with a good wil feruing, as to our Lord and not to men. <sup>8</sup> Knowing that every one what good foeuer he fhal doe, that fhal he a)receive of our Lord, whether he be bond, or free. <sup>9</sup> And you Maifters, doe the fame things to them, remitting threatnings: ἀνιέντες knowing that both their Lord and yours is in Heauen: and acceptation of Perfons is not with him. Deu. 10, 17.

<sup>10</sup> Hence-forth, Brethren, be ftrengthned in our Lord, πανοπλίαν and in the might of his power. <sup>11</sup> Put you on the armour of God, that you may ftãd againft the deceits of the Diuel. <sup>12</sup> For our wreftling is not againft flefh and

Eph. 2, 2. bloud: but againft Princes and Poteftates, againft the Rectours of the world of this darknes, againft the fpirituals of wickednes in the celeftials. <sup>13</sup> Therfore take the armour of God, that you may refift in the euil day, and ftand in al things perfect. <sup>14</sup> Stand therfore having your

loines girded in truth, and <sup>a</sup>)clothed with the breaft-plate of iuftice, <sup>15</sup> & hauing your feet fhod to the preparation of the Ghofpel of peace: <sup>16</sup> in al things taking the fhield of faith, wherwith you may extinguifh al the firie darts of the moft wicked one. <sup>17</sup> And take vnto you the helmet of faluation: and the fword of the fpirit (which is the word of God) <sup>18</sup> in al praier and fupplication praying at al time in fpirit: and in the fame watching in al inftance and fupplication for al the Saints: <sup>19</sup> and for me, that fpeach may be giuen me in the opening of my mouth with confidence, to make knowen the myfterie of the Ghofpel, <sup>20</sup> for the which I am a Legate in this chaine, fo that in it I may be bold according as I ought, to fpeake.

<sup>21</sup> And that you alfo may know the things about me, what I doe, Tychicus my deareft Brother and faithful Minifter in our Lord, wil make you vnderftand al things: <sup>22</sup> whom I haue fent to you for this fame purpofe, that you may know the things about vs, and he may comfort your harts. <sup>23</sup> Peace to the Brethren and <sup>b</sup>)charitie with faith from God the Father, and our Lord IESVS Chrift. <sup>24</sup> Grace with al that loue our Lord IESVS Chrift in incorruption. Amen.
