Chapter 12

Ioas vvilleth the prieftes to repaire vvhat needeth in the temple, receiuing al the money offered there. 6. VVhich they not performing, the high prieft prouideth that al is amended, 16. the prieftes receiuing only the money due to themfelues. 17. Hazael king of Syria taking Geth, and threatning Ierufalem is pacified vvith money. 19. Ioas is traitaroufly flaine by his feruantes, and his fonne Amafias reigneth.

n the feuenth yeare of Iehu reigned Ioas: and he reigned fourtie years in Ierufalem. The name of his mother was Sebia of Berfabee. ² And Ioas did right before our Lord al the daies, that Ioiada the prieft taught him. ³ But yet the excelfes he tooke not away: for the people immolated & burnt incense in the excelfes. 4 And Ioas fayd to the prieftes: Al the money of the fanctified thinges, which is brought into the temple of our Lord by the paffengers, which is offered for the a) price of a foule, and which of their owne accord, and of their owne free hart they bring into the temple of our Lord: ⁵ let the prieftes take it according to their order, and maynteine reparations of the house, if they shal see any thing that needeth reparation. ⁶ Therfore vntil the three and twenteth years of king Ioas, the prieftes did not make reparations of the temple. ⁷ And king Ioas called Ioiada the high prieft and the prieftes, faying to them: Why make you not the reparations of the temple? Take you therfore money no more according to your order, but render it to the reparation of the temple. 8 And the prieftes were prohibited to take money anie more of the people, and to make the reparations of the temple. ⁹ And Ioiada the high prieft tooke a treasurie, and opened a hole in the toppe, and sette it by the altar at the right hand of them that goe into the house of our Lord, and the priestes that kept the

doores, did caft into it all the money, that was brought to the temple of our Lord. 10 And when they faw that there was very much money in the treafurie, the kinges fcribe, and the high prieft went vp, and powred it out, and counted the money, that was found in the house of our Lord: 11 and they gaue it according to number and measure into their hand, which did ouerfee the masons of the house of our Lord: who bestowed it on carpenters, and on majons, fuch as wrought in the house of our Lord, ¹² and made reparation: and on them that hewed ftones, and that they should by trees, and ftones, that were hewed, fo that the reparation of the house of our Lord was accomplished in all thinges, which had neede of coft to vphold the house. 13 But yet there were not made of the fame money the water pottes of the temple of our Lord, and the fleshhookes, and cenfars, and trumpets, and euerie veffel of gold and filuer, of the money, that was brought into the temple of our Lord. 14 For it was geuen them that did the worke, that the temple of our Lord might be repayred: 15 and there was no account made with those men, that received the money to diftribute it to the craftes men, but vpon their fidelitie they bestowed it. ¹⁶ But the money for offence, & the money for finnes, they brought not into the temple of our Lord, because it was the priestes. 17 Then Hazael the king of Syria went vp, and fought agaynft Geth, and tooke it: and directed his face to goe vp to Ierufalem. ¹⁸ For which caufe Ioas the king of Iuda tooke al the fanctified thinges, which Iofaphat, and Ioram, and Ochozias his fathers the kinges of Iuda had a)confecrated, and which him felf had offered: and al the filuer, that could be found in the treasures of the temple of our Lord, and in the kinges palace: and fent it to Hazael the king of Syria, and he retyred from Ierufalem. ¹⁹ But the reft of the wordes of Ioas, and all that he did, are not thefe thinges writen in the Booke of the wordes of the daies of the kinges of Iuda? 20 And his feruantes arofe, and confpired among them felues, and ftroke loas in the

house of Mello in the descent of Sella. ²¹ For Iosachar the fonne of Semaath, and Iozabad the sonne of Somer his feruantes, stroke him, and he died: and they buried him with his fathers in ^{a)}the Citie of Dauid, and Amasias his sonne reigned for him.
