

Chapter 8

By fratrageme of an ambushment the citie of Hai is taken and burned, and al the inhabitantes flaine. 29. The king hanged. 30. An Altar built, Sacrifice offered, 32. the law written in stones, the people bleffed, and the bleffinges and curfinges read before them al.

And our Lord said to Iofue: Feare not, neither doe thou dread: take with thee al the multitude of fighting men, and ryfing goe vp vnto the towne of Hai. Behold I haue deliuered into thy hand the King therof, & the people, and the citie and the land. ² And thou shalt do to the citie of Hai, and to the King therof, as thou haft done to Iericho, and to the King therof: but the praye and al the cattel you shal spoyle for your felues: ^a)lay ambushmentes to the citie behind it. ³ And Iofue arose, and al the hoste of the men of warre with him, to goe vp into Hai: and thirtie thousand chosen valiant men he sent in the night, ⁴ and commanded them, saying: Lay ambushmentes behinde the citie: neither retyre you farre of: and you shal al be readie. ⁵ But I and the rest of the multitude, which is with me, wil goe vp on the contrarie side against the citie. And when they shal issue out against vs, as we did before, we wil flee, and turne our backes: ⁶ til purfewing they be drawn forward farre from the citie: for they wil thinck that we flee as before. ⁷ We therefore fleeing, and they purfewing, you shal rise out of the ambushmentes, and shal waite the citie: and our Lord your God wil deliuer it into your handes. ⁸ And when you shal take it, burne it, and you shal doe al thinges so, as I haue commanded. ⁹ And he dismissed them away, and they went on to the place of the ambushment, and fate between Bethel and Hai, at the West side of the citie of Hai. But Iofue that night stayed in the middes of the people, ¹⁰ and ryfing

early he mustered his soldiars, and went vp with the ancientes in the fronte of the hofte, enuironed with the ayde of the fighting men. ¹¹ And when they were come, and were gone vp directly againft the citie, they ftoode on the North fide of the citie, betwen which and them was a valley in the middes. ¹² And ^a)fiue thoufand men had he chofen, and fette in the embushmentes betwen Bethel and Hai on the Weft fide of the fame citie: ¹³ but al the reft of the hofte went in battel aray on the North fide, fo that the laft of the multitude did reach to the Weft fide of the citie. Iofue therfore went that night, and ftoode in the middes of the valley. ¹⁴ Which when the King of Hai had feene, he made haft in the mourning, and iffued forth with al the hofte of the citie, and bent his armie toward the defert, being ignorant that there lay embushmentes fecretly behind his backe. ¹⁵ But Iofue, and al Ifrael gaue backe, feyning feare, and fleeing by the way of the wildernes. ¹⁶ But they cried alowde together, and encouraging one an other, purfewed them. And when they were gone from the citie, ¹⁷ and ^b)not one remained in the citie of Hai and Bether, that purfewed not Ifrael (euen as they had rushed out leauing the townes open,) ¹⁸ our Lord faid to Iofue: ^c)Lift vp the shield, that is in thy hand, againft the citie of Hai, for I wil deliuer it to thee. ¹⁹ And when he had lifted vp his shield againft the citie, the embushmentes, that lay hidde, rofe vp immediatly: and going to the citie, tooke and burnt it. ²⁰ And the men of the citie, that purfewed Iofue, looking backe and feeing the fmoke of the citie rife vp euen to heauen, they could no more flee hither and thither: efpecially whereas they, that had feyned running away, and went toward the wildernes, moft valiantly refifted againft the purfewers. ²¹ And Iofue and al Ifrael feeing that the citie

was taken, and the smoke of the citie rose vp, returning he stroke the men of Hai. ²² For they also that had taken and burnt the citie, issuing out of the citie against their owne men, beganne to strike the enemies in the middes of them. When the aduersaries therefore were slaine on both sides, so that none of so great a multitude was saved, ²³ they tooke the King of the citie of Hai alieue, and presented him to Iosue. ²⁴ Therefore all being slaine, that had pursued Israel fleeing to the desertes, and falling by the sword in the same place, the children of Israel returning stroke the citie. ²⁵ And there were that fell that same day from man vnto woman, twelue thousand men, all of the citie of Hai. ²⁶ But Iosue plucked not in his hand, which he had stretched forth on high, holding the shield til all the inhabitantes of Hai were slaine. ²⁷ And the cattel and the praye of the citie the children of Israel diuided among them, as our Lord had commanded Iosue. ²⁸ Who burnt the citie, and made it a heape for euer: ²⁹ the king also therof he hong on a gibbet vntil euening and the going downe of the sunne. And he commanded, and they tooke downe his corps from the gibbet: and threw it in the verie entring of the citie, heaping vpon it a great heape of stones, which remaineth vntil this present day. ³⁰ Then Iosue built an altar to our Lord the God of Israel in mount Hebal, ³¹ as Moyse the seruant of our Lord had commanded the children of Israel, and it is written in the volume of the law of Moyse: an Altar of unhewed stones which yron hath not touched; and he offered vpon it holocaustes to our Lord, and immolated pacifique victimes. ³² And he wrote vpon stones the Deuteronomie of the law of Moyse, which he had ordered before the children of Israel. ³³ And all the people, and the ancients, and the princes and iudges stoode on both sides of the arke, in the sight of the priestes that carried the arke of the couenant of our Lord, as well the stranger as also the man of the same countrie. The half part of them beside mount Garizim, and halfe beside

commanded. And first in deede he ^ableffed the people of Ifrael. ³⁴ After this he reade al the wordes of the bleffing & the curfing, and al thinges that were written in the volume of the law. ³⁵ Nothing of thofe thinges, which Moyfes had commanded, did he leaue vntouched, but he repeated al thinges before al the multitude of Ifrael, the wemen and children and ftrangers, that dwelt among them.
