

## Chapter 1

*Vnder a general captaine of the tribe of Iuda, assited by the tribe of Simeon, Israell subdueth diuers cities of the gentiles. (12. Othoniel taking Cariath septher possesseth it, and marieth Calebs daughter, obtaining also addition of her dowrie.) 21. Iebuseites yet dwel in Hierusalem with Beniamin, 27. and the Chananeites with diuers of the tribes.*

**A**fter the death of Iofue the children of Israel<sup>a</sup> consulted our Lord, saying: Who shall goe vp before vs against the Chananeite, and shall be captaine of the warre? <sup>2</sup> And our Lord said: <sup>b</sup>Iudas shall goe vp: behold I haue deliuered the Land into his handes. <sup>3</sup> And Iudas said to Simeon his brother: Come vp with me into my lotte, and fight against the Chananeite, that I also may goe forward with thee into thy lotte. And Simeon went with him. <sup>4</sup> And Iudas went vp, and our Lord deliuered the Chananeite, and the Pherezeite into their handes: and they strooke in Bezeck ten thousand men. <sup>5</sup> And they found Adonibezek in Bezeck, and fought against him, and strooke the Chananeite, and the Pherezeite. <sup>6</sup> And Adonibezek fled: whom pursuing they tooke, cutting of the extreme partes of his handes and feete. <sup>7</sup> And Adonibezek said: Seuentie kinges hauing the extreme partes of their handes and feete cut of, gathered vp the reliques of meates vnder my table: as I haue done, so hath God repayed me. And they brought him into Ierusalem, and there he died. <sup>8</sup> Therefore the children of Iudas assaulting Ierusalem, tooke it, and strooke it in the edge of the sword, setting the whole citie on fyre. <sup>9</sup> And afterward going downe they fought against the Chananeite, which dwelled in the mountaines, and fourthward, and in the champaine countries.

<sup>10</sup> And Iudas going forward againft the Chananeite, that dwelled in Hebron (the name wherof was before time Cariatharbe) ftroke Sefai, and Ahiman, and Tholmai: <sup>11</sup> and departing thence went to the inhabitantes of Dabir, the old name wherof was Cariath Sepher, that is, a citie of letters. <sup>12</sup> And Caleb faid: He that shal ftrike Cariath Sepher, and fpoile it, I wil geue him Axa my daughter to wife. <sup>13</sup> And when Othoniel the fonne of Cenez, the yonger brother of Caleb had taken it, he gaue him Axa his daughter to wife. <sup>14</sup> Whom going on her way her husband admonifhed to aske a field of her father. To whom, when she had fighed fitting on her affe, Caleb faid: What aileth thee? <sup>15</sup> But she answered: Geue me a bleffing, for a drie land thou haft geuen me: geue me alfo a waterie. Caleb therefore gaue her a waterie ground aboue, & waterie beneath. <sup>16</sup> And the children of the Cineite the cofin of Moyfes went vp from the citie of palmes, with the children of Iudas into the defert of his lotte, which is at the fouth fide of Arad, and dwelt with him. <sup>17</sup> But Iudas went with Simeon his brother, and together they ftroke the Chananeite that dwelt in Sephaath, and flew him. And the name of the citie was called, Horma, that is, Anathema. <sup>18</sup> And Iudas tooke Gaza with the coaftes therof, & Afcalon, and Accaron with their boundes. <sup>19</sup> And our Lord was with Iudas, and he poffeffed the mountaines: neither could he deftroy the inhabitantes of the valley, becaufe they had manie <sup>a</sup>)hooked chariotes. <sup>20</sup> And they gaue to Galeb Hebron, as Moyfes had faid, who deftroyed out of it the three fonnnes of Enac. <sup>21</sup> But the Iebufeite the inhabiter of Ierufalem the children of Benjamin deftroyed not: and the Iebufeite dwelt with the children of Benjamin in Ierufalem vntil this prefent day. <sup>22</sup> The houfe alfo of Iofeph went vp into Bethel, and our Lord was with them. <sup>23</sup> For when they befieged the citie, which before was called Luza, <sup>24</sup> they faw a man comming out of the citie,

and said to him: Shew vs the entrance of the citie, and we wil shew thee mercie. <sup>25</sup> Who when he had shewed them, they ftroke the citie in the edge of the fword: but that man, and al his kinred they difmiffed. <sup>26</sup> Who being difmift, went into the Land of the Hetthims, and built there a citie, and called it Luza: which is fo called vntil this prefent day. <sup>27</sup> Manaffes alfo deftroyed not Bethfan, and Thanac with their litle townes, and the inhabitantes of Dor, and Ieblaam, and Mageddo with their litle townes. And the Chananeite began to dwel with them. <sup>28</sup> But after that Ifrael was waxen ftrong, he made them tributaries, and would not deftroy them. <sup>29</sup> Ephraim alfo killed not the Chananeite, that dwelt in Gazer, but dwelt with him. <sup>30</sup> Zabulon deftroyed not the inhabitantes of Cetron, & Naalol: but the Chananeite dwelt in the middes of him, and was made tributarie to him. <sup>31</sup> Afer alfo deftroyed not the inhabitantes of Accho, and of Sidon, of Ahalab, and Achazib, and Helba, and Aphec, and Rohob: <sup>32</sup> and he dwelt in the middes of the Chananeite the inhabiter of that Land, neither did he kil them. <sup>33</sup> Nepthali alfo deftroyed not the inhabitantes of Bethfames, & Bethanath: and he dwelt in the middes of the Chananeite the inhabiter of the Land, and the Bethfamites & Bethanites were tributaries to him. <sup>34</sup> And the Amorrheite ftraytened the children of Dan in the mountaine, and gaue them not place to goe downe to the playne: <sup>35</sup> and he dwelt in mount Hares which is interpreted shelles, in Aialon and Salebim. And the hand of the houfe of Iofeph was agrauated, and he became tributarie to him. <sup>36</sup> And the border of the Amorrheite was from the Afcent of the Scorpion, the rocke, and the higher places.
