An Angel reciting manie benefites of God towardes Ifrael, and their ingratitude, 4. they weepe for their faultes. 10. After the death of Iofue and other ancientes of his time, the people often fal, and repenting are deliuered from afflictions, 19. but ftil fal againe worfe and worfe.

nd the ^{a)}Angel of our Lord went vp from Galgal to the place of weepers, and faid: I brought you out of Ægypt, and haue brought you into the Land, for the which I fware to your fathers: and I promifed that I would not make fruftrate my couenant with you for euer: ² onlie fo that you should not make a league with the inhabitantes of this Land, but should ouerthrow their altares: and you would not heare my voice: why haue you done this? ³ For the which caufe I would not deftroy them from before your face: that you may have enemies, and their goddes may be a ruine vnto you. ⁴ And when the Angel of our Lord fpake thefe wordes to al the children of Ifrael: they lifted vp their voice, and wept. ⁵ And the name of that place was called, the place of weepers, or of teares: and b) there they immolated hoftes to our Lord. ⁶ Iofue therfore difmiffed the people, and the children of Ifrael went euerie one into his poffeffion, to obtayne it: ⁷ and they ferued our Lord al his daies, and the daies of the ancientes, of them that lived a long time after him, and knew all the workes of our Lord, which he had done with Ifrael. ⁸ And Iofue the fonne of Nun, the feruant of our Lord, died, being a hundred and ten yeares old, ⁹ and they buried him in the borders of his poffeffion in Thamnathfare in the mount of Ephraim, on the North fide of

mount Gaas. ¹⁰ And al that generation was gathered to their fathers: and there role others, that knew not our Lord, and the workes which he had done with Ifrael. ¹¹ And the children of Ifrael did euil in the fight of our Lord, and ferued Baalim. ¹² And they left our Lord the God of their fathers, that had brought them out of the Land of Ægypt: and followed ftrange goddes, and the goddes of the peoples, that dwelt round about them, and adored them: and they prouoked our Lord to anger, ¹³ leaving him, and feruing Baal and Aftaroth. ¹⁴ And our Lord being wrath againft Ifrael, delivered them into the handes of ranfackers: who tooke them and fold them to the enemies, that dwelt round about: neither could they refift their aduerfaries: ¹⁵ but whither foeuer they had meant to goe, the hand of our Lord was vpon them, as he fpake, and fware to them: and they were vehemently afflicted. ¹⁶ And our Lord ^a)rayfed vp Iudges, that should deliver them from the handes of the wafters: but neither would they hear them, ¹⁷ fornicating with ftrange goddes, and adoring them. They did quickly forfake the way, in the which their fathers had gone: and hearing the commandementes of our Lord, they did al thinges contrarie. ¹⁸ And when our Lord rayfed vp Iudges, in their daies he was moued with mercie, and heard the groninges of the afflicted, and delivered them from the flaughter of the wafters. ¹⁹ But after the Iudge was dead, they returned, and did much worfe things then their fathers had done, following ftrange goddes feruing them, and adoring them. They left not their inuentions, and the verie hard way, by which they were accuftomed to walke. ²⁰ And the furie of our Lord was angrie againft Ifrael, & faid: Becaufe this nation hath made my couenat fruftrate, which I had made with their fathers, & hath cõtemned my voice: ²¹ I alfo wil not deftroy the nations which Iofue did let alone, and died: ²² that in them I may trie Ifrael, whether they wil keepe the way of the Lord, and walke in it, as their fathers

kept it, or no. 23 Our Lord therfore left al thefe nations, and would not quickly ouerthrow them, neither deliuered them into the handes of Iofue.
