## Chapter 17

Michas and his mother cause a grauen, and a molten idol to be made of filuer. 5. He maketh one of his sonnes priest for the idol, 10. and for the same purpose hyreth also a Leuite.

The third part. Of certaine accidentes which happened in the time of the Iudges.

here was at that time a certain man of mount Ephraim named Michas, <sup>2</sup> who faid to his mother: The thousand and hundred filuer peeces, which thou hadft feparated to thy felfe, and concerning the which thou didft fweare in my hearing, behold I haue, and they are with me. To whom she faid: Bleffed be my fonne to the Lord. <sup>3</sup> He therfore rendred them to his mother, who had faid to him: I have confecrated and vowed this filter to the Lord, that my fonne may receiue it of my hand, and make a) a grauen and a molten (god) and now I deliuer that to thee. 4 He rendred them therfore to his mother: who tooke two hundred filuer peeces and gaue them to the filuerfmith, that he might make of them a grauen and a molten (god) which was in the house of Michas. <sup>5</sup> Who separated also therein a litle house to the god, and made an Ephod, and Theraphim, that is to fay, a prieftlie veftiment, and idoles: and he b) filled the hand of one of his fonnes, and he became his prieft. 6 In those daies there was not a king in Ifrael, but euerie one did that, which femed right to him felf. <sup>7</sup> There was also an other yong man of Bethlehem Iuda, of the kinred therof: and he was a Leuite, and dwelt

there. 8 And going forth out of the citie of Bethelehem, he would feiourne wherefoeuer he should find it comodious for him. And when he was come into mount Ephraim, making his iourney, and had turned afide a litle into the house of Michas, 9 he was demanded of him whence he came. Who answered: I am a Leuite of Bethlehem Iuda, and I goe to dwel where I shal be able, and shal perceive it to be profitable for me. <sup>10</sup> And Michas faid: Abide with me, and be to me a father and a prieft, and I wil geue thee euerie years tenne filuer peeces, and duble liuerie, and the thinges that be necessarie for victual. <sup>11</sup> He was content, and abode with the man, and was vnto him as one of his fonnes. 12 And Michas filled his hand, and had the yong man for a prieft with him, faying: 13 Now I know that God wil do me good a)hauing a prieft of the Leuitical kinde.
