## Chapter 1

Nabuchodonofor king of Afsyrians ouercometh Arphaxad The first part. king of the Medes: 7. fummoneth manie other nations to fubmitte themfelues to his Empyre: 11. which they refufing he threatneth reuenge.

The occafion of the Iewes perfection at this time.

rphaxad <sup>a)</sup>therfore king of the Medes had fubdued manie nations to his empire, & he built a moft mightie citie, which he called Ecbatanis, <sup>2</sup> of ftone fquared and hewed: he made walles therof in height feuentie cubites, and in breadth thirtie cubites, and the towers thereof he made in height an hundred cubites. <sup>3</sup> But each fide of them was in foure fquare twentie foote long, and he made the gates thereof according to the height of the towers: <sup>4</sup> and he <sup>b</sup>)gloried as mightie in the force of his armie, and in the glorie of his chariotes. <sup>5</sup> In the twelfth years of his reigne: Nabuchodonofor the king of the Affyrians, who reigned in Niniue the greate citie, fought against Arphaxad, and ouercame him <sup>6</sup> in the great field, which is called Ragau, about Euphrates, and Tigris, and Iadafon in the field of Erioch the king of the Elicians. <sup>7</sup> Then was the kingdom of Nabuchodonofor exalted, and his hart was elevated: and he fent to al, that dwelt in Cilicia and Damafcus, and Libanus, <sup>8</sup> and to the nations, that are in Carmelus, and Cedar, and the inhabitantes of Galilee in the great field of Efdrelon, <sup>9</sup> and to al that were in Samaria, and beyond the river Iordan euen to Ierufalem, and al the land of Ieffe til you come to the borders of Æthiopia. <sup>10</sup> To al thefe Nabuchodonofor king of the Affyrians fent meffengers: <sup>11</sup> who al with one minde faid nay, & fent them backe emptie, and rejected them without honour. <sup>12</sup> Then Nabuchodonofor the king taking indignation against al that
