## Chapter 12

Iudith is brought into Holofernes treafurehoufe, 2. hath leave to abftaine from the Gentils meates, 5. and to goe forth in the night to pray. 10. The fourth day she cometh to Holofernes banket, 16. he is taken with concupifcence, and drinketh very much wine.

hen he bad her goe in where his treafures were layd vp, and bad her tarie there, and he appoynted what should be geuen her of his owne banket. <sup>2</sup> To whom Iudith anfwered, and faid: Now, <sup>a)</sup>I can not eate of thefe thinges, which thou commandeft to be geuen me, left there come difpleafure vpon me: but I will eate of thefe thinges, which I have brought. <sup>3</sup> To whom Holofernes faid: If thefe thinges which thou haft brought with thee shal fayle thee, what shal we doe to thee. 4 And Iudith faid: Thy foule liueth my lord, that thy handmayde shal not fpend al thefe thinges, til God doe by my hand thefe thinges, which I haue purpofed. And his feruantes brought her into the tabernacle, which he had commanded. <sup>5</sup> And whiles she went in, she defired that fhe might have licence to goe forth, in the night and before day to prayer, and to befech our Lord. <sup>6</sup> And he commanded his chamberlaynes, that as it pleafed her, she should goe out & come in to adore her God for three dayes. <sup>7</sup> And she went forth in the nightes into the vale of Bethulia, and washed her felf in a fountaine of water. <sup>8</sup> And as she came vp, she prayed our Lord the God of Ifrael, that he would direct her way to the deliverie of his people. <sup>9</sup> And going in, she remayned <sup>b</sup>)pure in the tabernacle, vntil she tooke her owne meate in the euening. <sup>10</sup> And it came to paffe in the fourth day, Holofernes made a fupper to his feruantes, and fayd to Vagao his eunuch: Goe, and perfwade

that Hebrew woman, that fhe confent of her owne accord to dwel with me. <sup>11</sup> For it is a foule thing with the Affyrians, if a woman mocke a man in doing, that fhe paffe free from him. <sup>12</sup> Then Vagao went in to Iudith, & faid: Let not the good yong maide feare to Puella. goe in to my Lord, that she may be honoured before his face, that she may eate with him and drinke wine in iovfulnes. <sup>13</sup> To whom Iudith anfwered: Who am I, that I should gaynefay my lord? <sup>14</sup> Al that fhal be good and beft before his eies, wil I doe. And whatfoeuer shal pleafe him, that shal be beft to me al the dayes of my life. <sup>15</sup> And she arofe, and decked herfelf with her garmentes, and going in she ftood before his face. <sup>16</sup> And the hart of Holofernes was ftrooken: for he burnt in the concupifcence of her. <sup>17</sup> And Holofernes faid to her: Drinke now, and fit downe in ioyfulnes, becaufe thou haft found grace before me. <sup>18</sup> And Iudith faid: I wil drinke my lord, becaufe my foule is magnified this day aboue al my dayes. <sup>19</sup> And she tooke, and did eate, and dranke before him those thinges, which her handmayde had prepared her. <sup>20</sup> And Holofernes was made pleafant toward her, and dranke wine exceeding much, fo much as he had neuer drunke in his life?
