Chapter 24

Balaam forced by the euidence of truth (though not converted in wil to ferue God, whom he confesseth to be omnipotent) prophecieth ftil more good of Ifrael: 10. wherfore Balac interrupteth him, and he answereth plainly that God almightie wil haue it fo. 15. And so proceeding he prophecieth of Christ. 20. Also of Amalacheites, Cineites, and Italians.

nd when Balaam had feene that it pleafed our Lord that he should bleffe Ifrael, he went not as before he had gone, to feeke Southfaying: but directing his countenance against the defert, ² and lifting vp his eies, he faw Ifrael abiding in their tentes by their tribes: and the fpirit of God coming a)vehemently vpon him, ³ taking vp his parable he faid: Balaam the fonne of Bephor hath faid: The man hath faid whofe eve is ftopped: 4 The hearer of the wordes of God hath faid: he that hath beholden the vifion of the Omnipotent, he that falleth, and fo his eies are opened: 5 How beautiful are thy tabernacles ô Iacob, and thy tentes ô Ifrael! ⁶ As woodie valleis, as watered gardens befide the riuers, as tabernacles which the Lord hath pitched, as cedres by the waters fide. ⁷ Water shal flow out of his bucket, and his feede shal be into manie waters. For Agag shal his king be taken away, and his kingdom shal be taken away. 8 God hath brought him out of Ægypt, whofe ftregth is like to the rhinocerote. They shal deuoure nations his enimies, and breake their bones, and pearce them with arrowes. 9 Lying he hath flept as a lion, and as a lioneffe, whom none shal be bold to rayfe vp. He that bleffeth thee, him felf also shal be bleffed: he that curfeth thee, shal be reputed accurft. ¹⁰ And Balac being angrie against Balaam, clapping his handes together faid: To curfe mine enemies I called thee, whom

thou contrariewife haft bleffed the third time: 11 returne to thy place. I was determined verily to honour thee magnifically, but the Lord hath deprived thee of the honour appointed. 12 Balaam made answer to Balac: did I not fay to thy meffengers, whom thou didft fend to me: 13 If Balac would geue me his house ful of filuer and gold, I can not paffe the word of the Lord my God, to vtter of my owne minde either any good, or euil: but whatfoeuer the Lord shal fay, that wil I fpeake? ¹⁴ But yet going to my people, I wil geue thee counfel, what thy people shal doe to this people in the laft time. ¹⁵ Therfore taking vp his parable, againe he faid: Balaam the fonne of Beor hath faid: The man whofe eye is ftopped, hath faid: 16 the hearer of the wordes of God hath faid: who knoweth the doctrine of the Highest, and feeth the vifions of the Omnipotent, who falling hath his eies opened: ¹⁷ I shal fee him, but not now: I shal behold him but not neere. a)A STARRE SHAL RISE out of Iacob, and a rodde shal arife from Ifrael: and shal ftrike the dukes of Moab, and shal waift al the children of Seth. ¹⁸ And Idumea shal be his poffession: the inheritance of Seir shal come to their enemies: but Ifrael shal doe manfully. ¹⁹ Of Iacob shal he be that shal rule, and shal deftroy the remaines of the citie. ²⁰ And when he had feene Amalec, taking vp his parable, he faid: Amalec the beginning of Gentiles, whose latter endes shal be deftroyed. ²¹ He faw also the Cineite: and taking vp his parable, he faid: Thy habitation in deede is ftrong: but if thou build thy neft in a rocke, ²² and thou be chosen of the stocke of Cin, how long shalt thou be able to continew? For Affur shal take thee. 23 And taking vp his parable againe he fpake: Alas, who shal liue, when God shal doe thefe thinges? ²⁴ They shal come in galleies from Italie, they shal ouercome the Affyrians,

and shal waift the Hebrewes, and at the laft them felues also shal perish. ²⁵ And Balaam rofe, and returned into ^{a)}his place: Balac also returned the way that he came.
