THE ARGVMENT OF THE BOOKES OF ES-DRAS.

1. Efdr. 7. Esdras a holie Prieft and Scribe, of the ftocke of Aaron, by the line of Eleazar, vyriteth the hiftorie of Gods people, in, and prefently after their captinitie in Babilon: vvhich Nehemias an other godlie Prieft profecuteth, vvhofe Hebrew. booke is also called the fecond of Efdras, becaufe in the Hebrevv and Greke they are but one booke, relating the acts of them both. The other two books called *the* third and fourth of Efdras, touching the fame matter, are not in the Hebrew, nor received into the Canon of holie Scripture, though the Greke Church hold the third booke as Canonicall, and placeth it first, because it conteyneth thinges donne before the other.

In the two here following, which are vndoubtedly holie Scripture S. Ierom fayth, that Efdras and Ne-Epift. ad Paulin. hemias (to witte the Helper, and Comforter from God) reftored the Temple, and built the walles of the citie; adding that al the troope of the people returning into their countrie, also the description of Priestes, Leuites, Ifraelites, Profelites, and the workes of walles and towres divided by feueral families, alived in cortice præferunt, aliud in medulla retinent, flew one thing in the barke, kepe an other thing in the marrow: fignifying that this hiftorie hath both a literal, and a myftical fenfe. According to the letter, this first booke shevveth the reduction of Gods people from Babylon, in the first fix chapters. In the other foure, their inftruction by Efdras after their returne.

The two bookes of Efdras and Nehemias are but one in the

The third and fourth are not canonical.

This hiftorie hath alfo a fpiritual fenfe.
