Chapter 3

An Altar is built for facrifice. 4. The feaft of Tabernacles folemnly celebrated. 8. And in the fecond yeare (after their returne) the Temple is founded with great ioy of the people, and mourning of fome.

nd now the feuenth moneth was come, and the children of Ifrael were in their cities: the people therfore was gathered together as it were one man into Ierufalem. ² And Iofue the fonne of Iofedec rofe vp, and his brethren the Prieftes, and Zorobabel the fonne of Salathiel, and his brethren, and they built the altar of the God of Ifrael, that they might offer on it holocauftes, as it is writen in the law of Moyfes the man of God. ³ And they placed the altar of God vpon his feete, the people of the lands round about putting them a)in feare, & they offered vpon it holocauft to our Lord morning and euening. ⁴ And they made the folemnitie of tabernacles, as it is writen, and holocauft euery day by order according to the præcept, the worke of the day in his day. ⁵ And after thefe thinges the continual holocauft, as wel in the Calendes, as in all the folemnities of our Lord, that were confecrated, and in al wherein there was offered voluntarily a gift to our Lord. ⁶ From the first day of the feuenth moneth they began to offer holocauft to our Lord: moreouer the temple of God was not yet founded. ⁷ And they gaue money to hewers of ftones and to majons: meate also and drinke, and oyle to the Sidonians and Tyrians, that they flould bring ceder trees from Libanus to the fea vnto Ioppe, according to that which Cyrus the king of the Perfians had commanded them. 8 And in the fecond years of their coming to the temple of God in Ierufalem, the fecond moneth, began Zorobabel the fonne of Salathiel, and Iofue the fonne of Iofedec, and the reft of their brethren the Prieftes,

and the Leuites, and all that were come from the captiuitie into Ierufalem, and they appoynted Leuites from twentie yeares and vpward, that they fhould haften forward the worke of our Lord. ⁹ And Iofue ftood and his fonnes, and his brethren, Cedmihel, and his fonnes, and the children of Iuda, as it were one man, that they might be inftant upon them, that did the worke in the temple of God: the fonnes of Henadad, and their fonnes, and their brethren Leuites. ¹⁰ The temple therfore of our Lord being founded by the masons, the Priestes stood in their attyre with trumpettes: and the Leuites the children of Afaph in cymbals, to prayfe God a) by the handes of Dauid the king of Ifrael. 11 And they fang together in hymnes, and confession to our Lord: Because he is good, because his mercie is for euer vpon Ifrael. Al the people also made a shoute with a lowde crie in praying our Lord, because the temple of our Lord was founded. ¹² Verie manie also of the Priestes and the Leuites, and the princes of the fathers, & the ancients, that had feene the former temple, when they faw this temple founded, b)they wept with a lowd voyce: and manie flouting in iov, lifted vp their vovce. ¹³ Neither could anie man different the voice of the crie of them that reioyced, and the voice of the weeping of the people: for one with an other the people flowted with a lowd crie, and the voice was heard far of.
