## Chapter 26

The Ziphians bewtraying the place, Saul befiegeth Dauid. 5. Who by night goeth where Saul and his men are a fleepe, 9. hurteth him not: 12. but taketh from him his fpeare and bottle of water: 14. sheweth what he hath done. 21. Saul againe confeffeth his fault, and promifeth peace.

nd there came Zepheites vnto Saul in Gabaa, faying: Behold Dauid is hid in the hil Hachila, which is ouer againft the wildernes. <sup>2</sup> And Saul arofe, and went downe into the defert Ziph, and with him three thousand men of the chosen of Ifrael, to feeke Dauid in the defert Ziph. <sup>3</sup> And Saul camped in Gabaa Hachila, which was ouer against the wildernes in the way. And Dauid dwelt in the defert. And feing that Saul was come after him into the defert, 4 he fent difcouerers, and lerned that he was come thither moft certainly. <sup>5</sup> And Dauid arofe fecretly, and came to the place where Saul was: and when he had feene the place, wherein Saul flept, and Abner the fonne of Ner, the prince of his warre, and Saul fleeping in the tent, and the reft of the multitude round about him, <sup>6</sup> Dauid fpake to Achimelech the Hetheit, and Abifai the fonne of Seruia the brother of Ioab, faying: Who wil goe downe with me to Saul into the campe? And Abifai faid: I will goe with thee. <sup>7</sup> Dauid therefore and Abifai came to the people by night, and found Saul lying and fleeping in the tent, and his fpeare fixed in the ground at his head: and Abner, and the people fleeping round about him. <sup>8</sup> And Abifai faid to Dauid: God hath shut vp thine enemie this day into thy handes: now therefore I wil thruft him through with my fpeare in the earth once, and twife shal not neede. <sup>9</sup> And Dauid faid to Abifai: Kil him not: for <sup>a)</sup>who fhal extend his hand vpon the annointed of our

Lord, & shal be innocent? <sup>10</sup> And Dauid faid: Our Lord liueth, vnles our Lord shal ftrike him, or his day come to die, or defcending into battel he perish. <sup>11</sup> Our Lord be merciful vnto me, that I extend not my hand vpon the annointed of our Lord. Now therefore take the fpeare, which is at his head, & cuppe of water, and let vs goe. <sup>12</sup> Dauid therefore tooke the fpeare, and cuppe of water, which was at Saules head, and they went away: and there was none that fawe, or vnderftood, or awaked, but al flept, becaufe the dead fleepe <sup>a)</sup> of our Lord had fallen vpon them. <sup>13</sup> And when Dauid had paffed ouer againft, and ftood in the toppe of the mountaine farre of, and a good fpace betwen them, <sup>14</sup> Dauid cried to the people, and to Abner the fonne of Ner, faying: Wilt thou not anfwer Abner? And Abner anfwering fayd: Who art thou, that crieft and difquieteft the king? <sup>15</sup> And Dauid fayd to Abner: Art not thou a man? And who is like thee in Ifrael? why therefore haft thou not kept thy lord the king? for one of the multitude hath entered in to kil the king thy lord. <sup>16</sup> This thing is not good, which you have done: Our Lord liveth, you are the children of death, which have not kept your lord, the annointed of our Lord. Now therefore behold where the kinges fpeare is, & where the cup of water is, which was at his head. <sup>17</sup> And Saul knew Dauids voice, and fayd: Is this thy voice, my fonne Dauid? And Dauid fayd: My voice, my lord king, <sup>18</sup> and he faid: For what caufe doth my lord perfecute his feruant? What have I done? or what euil is there in my hand? <sup>19</sup> Now therefore heare, I pray, my lord King, the wordes of thy feruant: If our Lord ftirre thee vp against me, let there be odoure of facrifice: but if the fonnes of men, they are curfed in the fight of our Lord, which have caft me out this day, that I fould not dwel in the inheritance of our Lord, faving: Goe, ferue ftrange goddes. <sup>20</sup> And now let not my blood be fhed vpon the earth before our Lord, for the king of Ifrael, is come forth to feeke one flea, as the perdix is purfued

in the mountaines. <sup>21</sup> And Saul fayd: I haue finned, returne my fonne Dauid, for I wil no more doe thee euil, for that my life hath bene precious in thyne eies to day: for it appeareth that I have done foolishly, and have been ignorant of very many thinges. <sup>22</sup> And Dauid anfwering, fayd: Behold the kings fpeare, let one of the kings feruants paffe, and take it. <sup>23</sup> And our Lord wil reward euerie one according to his iuftice, and fidelitie: for our Lord hath delivered thee this day into my hand, & I would not extend my hand vpon the annointed of our Lord. <sup>24</sup> And as thy life hath bene magnified to day in myne eies, fo be my life magnified in the eies of our Lord, and deliuer he me from al diftreffe. <sup>25</sup> Saul therefore fayd to Dauid: Bleffed art thou my fonne Dauid: and truly doing thou shalt doe, and preuayling thou shalt preuaile. And Dauid went into his way, and Saul returned into his place.
