THE ARGVMENT OF THE SECOND BOOKE OF KINGES.

Befides a great part of the first booke, and beginning of the third, this fecond booke is wholly of King Dauid. VVhofe manie laudable Actes, as also his faultes (which were fewer) with his true repentance, and punishment are related, not in fuch method, as may eafily be divided into diffinct partes, in order of the chapters; but according to the diffinction of thinges contained, his fuccession to the royal crowne, first in Iuda, and after in al Israel, with the declination and death of his competitour Ifbofeth, are recorded in the 2. 3. 4. and 5. chapters. vertues, and praifes, to wit, his folemne mourning for Saul and that familie, his deuotion, fortitude, pietie, and gratitude are specially touched in the 1. 6. 7. 8. 9. and His finnes of adulterie with Bethfabee, of killing her husband Vrias, of pride in numbering his people, with his hartie repentance, and temporal punishment for the fame, are written from the 11. chapter to the 21, together with the 24. The 22. and 23. chapters conteyne his thankefgeuing to God for benefites received, and prophecie of thinges to come, with a catalogue of valiant men.
