Chapter 3

If bofeths forces daily decay, Dauid increafeth in powre, and hath manie fonnes. 7. Abner vpon occasion of a flander breaketh from If bofeth, and ferueth Dauid, bringing Michol to him, and much people of If rael. 23. Ioab of emulation and reuenge killeth Abner. 28. For which Dauid is offended with Ioab, 31. and mourneth for Abner.

here was made therefore long ftrife betwen the house of Saul, and betwen the house of Dauid: Dauid prospering and alwaies stronger then himfelf, but the house of Saul decreasing daily. ² And there were fonnes borne to Dauid in Hebron: and his first begotten was Ammon of Achinoam the Iezrahelite. ³ And after him Cheleab of Abigail the wife of Nabal of Carmel: moreouer the third Abfalom the fonne of Maacha the daughter of Tolmai king of Geffur. ⁴ And the fourth, Adonias, the fonne of Haggith: and the fifth Saphathia, the fonne of Abital. ⁵ The fixt also Iethraam of Egla the wife of Dauid. These were borne to Dauid in Hebron. ⁶ Therefore when there was battel betwen the house of Saul and house of Dauid, Abner the sonne of Ner ruled the house of Saul. ⁷ And Saul had a concubine named Refpha, the daughter of Aia. And Ifbofeth faid to Abner: 8 Why diddeft thou go in to my fathers concubine? Who being wrath exceedingly for the wordes of Ifbofeth, faid: What a) am I a dogges head againft Iuda this day, which have done mercie vpon the house of Saul thy father, and vpon his brethren and neerest freinds, & haue not deliuered thee into the hands of Dauid, & haft thou fought against me that thou mightest charge me for a woman to day? ⁹ Thefe things do God to Abner,

and thefe things adde he to him, vnleffe as our Lord hath fworne to Dauid, fo I doe truth to him. 10 That the kingdom be transferred from the house of Saul, and the throne of Dauid be exalted ouer Ifrael, and our Iuda, from Dan to Berfabee. 11 And he could not answer him any thing, because he feared him. 12 Abner therefore fent meffengers to Dauid for himfelf faying: Whofe is the land? And that they fhould fay: Make amitie with me, & my hand fhal be with thee: and I wil reduce vnto thee al Ifrael. ¹³ Who faid: Very wel: I wil make amitie with thee: but one thing I defire of thee, faying: Thou fhalt not fee my face before thou bring Michol the daughter of Saul: and fo thou fhalt come, and fee me. ¹⁴ And Dauid fent meffengers to Ifbofeth the fonne of Saul, faying: Reftore my wife Michol, which I betrothed to me for an hundred prepuces of the Philifthijms. ¹⁵ Ifbofeth therefore fent, and tooke her from her hufband Phaltiel, the fonne of Lais. 16 And her hufband followed her, weeping as farre as Bahurim: and Abner faid to him: Goe, and returne. Who returned. 17 Abner also spake to the ancientes of Israel, saying: Both yefterday and the day before you fought Dauid that he might reigne ouer you. ¹⁸ Now therefore do fo: because our Lord hath spoken to Dauid, saying: In the hand of my feruant Dauid I wil faue my people Ifrael from the hands of the Philiftijms, and of al their enemies. 19 And Abner spake also to Beniamin. And he went to speake vnto Dauid in Hebron al things which pleafed Ifrael, and al Beniamin. ²⁰ And he came to Dauid into Hebron with twentie men: and Dauid made a feaft to Abner, and to his men that came with him. 21 And Abner fayd to Dauid: I wil rife, that I may gather vnto thee my lord king al Ifrael, and may enter a league with thee, and thou mayeft reigne ouer al, as thy foule defireth. When Dauid therefore had brought Abner on the way, and he was gone in peace, ²² forthwith Dauids feruantes and Ioab came, having flayne the robbers, with a praye exceding great: and Abner was not with Dauid in Hebron, because he had now dismissed him, and he was departed in peace. ²³ And Ioab, and al the armie which

were with him, came afterward: it was therefore told Ioab, that Abner the fonne of Ner came to the king, and he difmiffed him, and he departed in peace. 24 And Ioab went in to the king, and faid: What haft thou done? Behold Abner came to thee: why didft thou difmiffe him and he is gone and departed? ²⁵ Knoweft thou not Abner the fonne of Ner, that to this end he came to thee, that he might deceive thee, and might know thy going out, and thy coming in, and vnderftand al things that thou doeft? ²⁶ Ioab therfore being gone from Dauid, fent meffengers after Abner, and brought him backe from the cefterne Sira, Dauid being ignorant therof. ²⁷ And when Abner was returned into Hebron, Ioab brought him afide to the middes of the gate, to fpake vnto him in guile: and ftroke him there in the privile partes, and he died, in reuenge of the bloud of Afael his brother. 28 Which when Dauid had heard, that the thing was now done, he faid: I am innocent, and my kingdom before God for euer from the bloud of Abner the fonne of Ner, ²⁹ and come it vpon the head of Ioab, and vpon al his fathers house: neither let there fayle of the house of Ioab one having a fluxe of feede, and a leper, and houlding the diftaffe, and falling by the fword, lacking bread. ³⁰ Ioab therefore and Abifai his brother flewe Abner, because he had killed Afael their brother in Gabaon in the battel. ³¹ And Dauid faid to Ioab, and to al the people, that were with him: Rent your garmentes, and be girded with facke clothes, and mourne before the funeral of Abner. Moreouer king Dauid followed the beere. 32 And when they had buried Abner in Hebron, king Dauid lifted vp his voice, and wept vpon the graue of Abner: and al the people also wept. 33 And the king mourning and lamenting Abner, fayd: Not as cowardes are wont to die, hath Abner died. ³⁴ Thy handes were not bound, and thy feete were not loden with fetters: but as men are wont to fal before the children of iniquitie, fo art thou fallen. And all the people dubling it wept vpon him. 35 And when al the multitude was come to take meate with Dauid, when it was yet cleere day Dauid fware, faying:

Thefe thinges do God to me, and thefe adde he, if before funne fet I fhal taft bread or any thing els. ³⁶ And al the people heard, and al thinges pleafed them which the king did in the fight of al the people. ³⁷ And al the people knewe, and al Ifrael in that day that it was not the kinges doing, that Abner the fonne of Ner was flayne. ³⁸ The king alfo faid to his feruantes: Are you ignorant that a prince and the greateft is flayne this day in Ifrael? ³⁹ But I as yet ^a)delicate, and annointed king: moreouer the fonnes of Saruia are hard to me: our Lord reward him that doth euil according to his malice.
