Chapter 12

Nathan the prophet by a parable induceth Dauid to condemne him felf of great finne, 7. blameth and threatneth him for the fame. 13. But vpon his confession denounceth remission of his finne, with referuation of temporal punishment, 15. the death of the childe. 24. Bethfabee beareth an other fonne, who is called Salomon. 26. The citie of Rabbath is taken, and a rich crowne with other praye.

ur Lord therfore fent Nathan to Dauid: Who when he was come to him, he fayd vnto him: There were two men in one citie, one riche, and the other poore. ² The rich man had sheepe, and oxen exceding manie. ³ But the poore man had nothing at al, befide one litle ewe, which he had bought and nourished, and which had growen in his houfe together with his children, eating of his bread, and drinking of his cuppe, and fleping in his bofome: and it was to him as a daughter. ⁴ And when a certayne ftranger was come to the riche man, he fparing to take of his owne fheepe and oxen, to make a feaft for that ftranger, which was come to him, tooke the poore mans ewe, and made meates thereof for the man that was come to him. ⁵ And Dauid being excedingly wrath with indignation against that man, fayd to Nathan: Our Lord liueth, the man that hath done this is the childe of death. ⁶ He fhal render the ewe fourefold, becaufe he hath done this thing, and hath not fpared. ⁷ And Nathan fayd to Dauid: Thou art that man. Thus fayth our Lord the God of Ifrael: I annointed thee to be king ouer Ifrael, and I delivered thee from the hand of Saul, ⁸ and gaue thee the houfe of thy lord, and the wives of the lord in the bofome, and have geuen thee the houfe of Ifrael and Iuda: and if thefe thinges be litle, I wil adde farre greater thinges vnto thee. ⁹ Why therefore haft thou contemned the word of the lord, that thou would ft doe euil in my fight? Vrias the Hetheite thou haft fmitten with the fword, & his wife thou haft taken to thy wife, and haft flavne him

with the fword of the children of Ammon. ¹⁰ For which thing the food fhal not depart from thy house a) for ever, becaufe thou haft defpifed me, and haft taken the wife of Vrias the Hetheite, to be thy wife. ¹¹ Therfore thus fayth our Lord: Behold, I wil rayfe vpon thee euil out of thine owne houfe, and wil take thy wives before thine eies, and geue them to thy neighbour, and he fhal flepe with thy wives in the fight of this Sunne. ¹² For thou haft done it fecretly: but I wil doe this word in the fight of al Ifrael, and in the fight of the Sunne. ¹³ And Dauid fayd to Nathan: I have finned to our Lord. And Nathan fayd to Dauid: Our Lord alfo hath taken away thy finne: thou fhalt not die. ¹⁴ Neuertheles, becaufe thou haft made the enemies of our Lord to blafpheme, for this thing, the fonne that is borne to thee, dying fhal dye. ¹⁵ And Nathan returned into his houfe. Our Lord alfo ftroke the child, which the wife of Vrias had borne to Dauid, and he was paft hope. ¹⁶ And Dauid befought our Lord for the child: and Dauid fafted a faft, and going in afide, lay vpon the ground. ¹⁷ And the ancientes of his houfe came, being earneft with him, that he would rife from the ground: who would not, neither did he eate meate with them. ¹⁸ And it chanced the feuenth day that the infant died: and the feruantes of Dauid feared to tel him, that the child was dead. For they fayd: Behold when the child yet liued, we fpake to him, and he heard not our voice: how much more if we fhal fay: The child is dead, wil he afflict him felf? ¹⁹ When Dauid therfore fawe his feruantes muttering, he vnderftood that the infant was dead: and he fayd to his feruantes: Is the child dead? Who anfwered him: He is dead. ²⁰ Dauid therfore role from the ground; and was washed and annoynted: and when he had changed

his garment, he entered into the houfe of our Lord: and adored, and came into his owne houfe, and he called for bread, and he did eate. ²¹ And his feruantes fayd vnto him: What thing is this, that thou haft done? for the infant, when he yet liued, thou didft faft and weepe: but the child being dead, thou didft rife vp, and haft eaten bread. ²² Who fayd: For the infant, whiles he yet liued, I fafted and wept: for I favd: Who knoweth if perhaps our Lord wil geue him to me, and the infant may liue? ²³ But now becaufe he is dead, why do I faft? Shal I be able to cal him againe any more? I fhal go to him rather: but he fhal not returne to me. ²⁴ And Dauid comforted Bethfabee his wife, and going in vnto her, flept with her: Who bare a fonne, and he called his name Salomon, and our Lord loued him. ²⁵ And he fent by the hand of Nathan the prophete, and called his name, Amiable to our Lord, becaufe our Lord loued him. ²⁶ Ioab therfore fought against Rabbath of the children of Ammon, and wonne the kinges citie. ²⁷ And Ioab fent meffengers to Dauid, faying: I have fought against Rabbath, and the Citie of waters is to be taken. ²⁸ Now therfore gather the reft of the people, and befiege the citie, & take it: left when the citie fhal be wafted of me, the victorie be afcribed to my name. ²⁹ Dauid therfore gathered al the people, and went forth against Rabbath: and when he had fought, he tooke it. ³⁰ And he tooke the crowne of their king from his head, in weight a talent of gold, having most pretious stones, and it was put vpon Dauids head. Yea & the praye of the citie he carved away exceding much: ³¹ bringing forth alfo the people therof fawed them, and drewe round about ouer them chariotes fhod with yron: and he diuided them with kniues, and drew them through in forme of brikes: fo did he to al the cities of the children of Ammon: and Dauid returned, and al the armie into Ierufalem.
