## Chapter 15

Abfalom getteth fauour of the people, 7. and confpireth in Hebron agaynft his father. 14. VVho fleeing, 19. with difficultie permitteth Ethas a ftranger to goe with him: 24. but fendeth Sadoc, and other prieftes and leuites with the arke back into the citie. 31. Sendeth Chufat to defeate Achitophels counfel.

herefore after thefe thinges Abfalom made him felf chariotes, and horfemen, and fiftie men, that should goe before him. <sup>2</sup> And Abfalom rifing early, ftoode befide the entrance of the gate, and euerie man that had bufines to the kinges iudgement, did Abfalom cal to him, and fayd: Of what citie art thou? Who anfwering fayd: Of fuch a tribe of Ifrael am I thy feruant. <sup>3</sup> And Abfalom anfwered him: Thy wordes feeme vnto me good and iuft. But there is none to hear thee appointed of the king. And Abfalom favd: <sup>4</sup> Oh who would appoint me iudge ouer the land, that al might come to me which have bufines, and I might iudge iuftly? <sup>5</sup> Yea and when a man came vnto him to falute him, he put forth his hand, and taking him, kyffed him. <sup>6</sup> And this did he to al Ifrael coming for iudgement, to be heard of the king, and he intifed the hartes of the men of Ifrael. <sup>7</sup> And after fourtie yeares, Abfalom fayd to king Dauid: Let me goe, and pay my vowes which I have vowed to our Lord in Hebron. <sup>8</sup> For thy feruant vowing did vow, when he was in Geffur of Syria, faying: If our Lord wil bring me againe into Ierufalem, I wil facrifice to our Lord. <sup>9</sup> And king Dauid fayd to him: Goe in peace. And he arofe, and went into Hebron. <sup>10</sup> And Abfalom fent fpies into al the tribes of Ifrael, faying: Forthwith as vou shal heare the found of the trumpet, fav ve: Abfalom reigneth in Hebron. <sup>11</sup> Moreouer with Abfalom there went two hundred men out of Ierufalem being called, going with a fimple hart, and vtterly ignorant of the caufe. <sup>12</sup> Abfalom alfo fent for Achitophel the Gilonite, Dauids counfeler, from his citie Gilo. And when he immolated victimes, there was made a ftrong confpiracie,

and the people running together increafed with Abfalom. <sup>13</sup> A meffenger therefore came to Dauid, faving: Al Ifrael with al their hart foloweth Abfalom. <sup>14</sup> And Dauid faid to his feruantes, that were with him in Ierufalem: Arife let vs flee: for there wil be no efcape for vs from the face of Abfalom: make haft to goe out, left coming perhaps he ouertake vs, and force ruine vpon vs, and ftrike the citie in the edge of the fword. <sup>15</sup> And the kinges feruantes faid to him: Al thinges whatfoeuer our lord the king fhal command, we thy feruantes wil gladly execute. <sup>16</sup> The king therefore went forth, and al his houfe on foote: & the king leift ten wemen his <sup>a</sup>)concubines to keepe the houfe. <sup>17</sup> And the king going forth & al Ifrael on their feete, ftoode farre from the houfe: <sup>18</sup> and al his feruantes walked by him, and the legions Cerethi, and Phelethi and al the Getheites, valiant warriers, fix hundred men which had followed him from Geth footemen, went before the king. <sup>19</sup> And the king faid to Ethai the Getheite: Why comeft thou with vs? returne and dwel with the king, becaufe thou art a ftranger, and art come forth out of thy place. <sup>20</sup> Yefterday thou cameft, and to day fhalt thou be forced to goe forth with vs? but I wil goe whither I fhal goe: returne, and leade backe thy brethren with thee, and our Lord wil doe with thee mercie, and veritie, becaufe thou haft flewed grace and fidelitie. <sup>21</sup> And Ethai anfwered the king, faying: The Lord liueth, and my lord the king liueth: for that in what place foeuer thou fhalt be, my lord king, either in death, or in life, there wil thy feruant be. <sup>22</sup> And Dauid faid to Ethai: Come, and paffe. And Ethai the Getheite paffed, and al the men that were with him, and the reft of the multitude. <sup>23</sup> And they al wept with a lowd voice, and al the people paffed: the king alfo went ouer the Torrent Cedron, and all the people marched against the way, that looketh to the defert. <sup>24</sup> And Sadoc alfo the prieft came, and all the Leuites with him carving the arke of the couenant of God, and they fette downe the

arke of God: & Abiathar afcended, til al the people was fully paffed, which was come forth of the citie. <sup>25</sup> And the king fayd to Sadoc: Cary backe the Arke of God into the citie: if I fhal finde grace in the fight of my Lord, he wil bring me agayne, and wil show me it, and his tabernacle. <sup>26</sup> But if he shal fay to me: Thou pleafeft me not: I am readie, let him doe that which is good before him. <sup>27</sup> And the king favd to Sadoc the prieft: O feer returne into the citie in peace: and Achimaas thy fonne, and Ionathas the fonne of Abiathar, your two fonnes let them be with you. <sup>28</sup> Behold I wil be hid in the champayne of the defert, til there come word from you aduertifing me. <sup>29</sup> Sadoc therefore and Abiathar carved backe the Arke of God into Ierufalem: and they taried there. <sup>30</sup> Moreouer Dauid went vp mount Oliuet, climbing & weeping, going bare foote, and his head a)couered, yea and al the people which was with him, their head couered went vp weeping. <sup>31</sup> And it was told Dauid that Achitophel alfo was in the confpiracie with Abfalom, and Dauid favd: Infatuate ô Lord I befech thee, the counfel of Achitophel. <sup>32</sup> And when Dauid went vp to the toppe of the mount, wherein he would adore our Lord, behold there mette him Chufai the Arachite, his garment rent and his head ful of earth. <sup>33</sup> And Dauid fayd to him: If thou come with me, thou shalt be a burden to me: <sup>34</sup> but if thou returne into the citie, and wilt fay to Abfalom: I am thy feruant, ô king: as I have been thy fathers feruant, fo I wil be thy feruant: thou shalt defeate the counfel of Achitophel. <sup>35</sup> And thou haft with thee Sadoch, and Abiathar the priefts: and euery word whatfoeuer thou shalt hear from out of the kinges houfe, thou shalt tel Sadoc, and Abiathar the prieftes. <sup>36</sup> And there are with them their two fonnes Achimaas the fonne of Sadoc, and Ionathas the fonne of Abiathar: and you shal fend by them vnto me euery word whatfoeuer you shal heare.
