nd when Dauid had paffed a litle the toppe of the Mount, Siba the feruant of Miphibofeth appeared coming to meete him, with two affes, which were loden with two hundred loaues, and a hundred bunches of raylens, an hundred maffes of figges, and a bottel of wine. ² And the king faid to Siba: What meane these thinges? And Siba answered: The affes are for the kinges houfhould to fitte on: and the loaues and the figges to eate for thy feruantes, and the wine to drinke if any man fhal fainte in the defert. ³ And the king faid: Where is thy mafters fonne? And Siba answered the king: He hath remained in Ierusalem, faying: This day wil the house of Israel restore me the kingdom of my father. 4 And the king faid to Siba: a)Let al thinges be thine that were Miphibofeths. And Siba faid: I befech thee let me find grace before thee, my lord king. ⁵ King Dauid therefore came as farre as Bahurim: & behold there came forth thence a man of the kinred of the house of Saul named Semei, the sonne of Sera, and he proceded going forth, & curfed. 6 And he threw ftones against Dauid, & against all the servantes of king Dauid & the whole people, & al the warriers went on the right, and the left fide of the king. ⁷ And thus fpake Semei when he curfed the king: Come forth, come forth thou man of bloud, and man of Belial. 8 Our Lord hath repayed thee al the bloud of the house of Saul: because thou haft inuaded the kingdom for him, and our Lord hath geuen the kingdom into the hand of Abfalom thy

fonne: and behold thyne euiles preffe thee, because thou art a man of bloud. 9 And Abifai the fonne of Seruia faid to the king: Why curfeth this dead dogge my lord the king? I wil goe, and ftrike of his head. ¹⁰ And the king faid: What is it to me and you, ye fonnes of Seruia? Let him alone that he may curfe: for our Lord hath a)commanded him to curfe Dauid: and who is he that dare fay, why hath he fo done? 11 And the king faid to Abifai, and to al his feruantes: Behold my fonne, that came out of my wombe, feeketh my life: how much more the fonne of Iemini? let him alone that he may curfe according to the precept of our Lord: 12 if perhaps our Lord may refpect mine affliction, and our Lord may render me good for this dayes curfing. ¹³ Dauid therefore walked and his companie in the way with him. And Semei by the banke on the hils fide, went ouer againft him, curfing, and cafting ftones against him, and sprinkling earth. ¹⁴ The king therefore came, and al the people with him wearie, and they were refreshed there. ¹⁵ But Abfalom and al his people entered into Ierufalem, yea and Achitophel with him. ¹⁶ And when Chufai the Arachite Dauids frend was come to Abfalom, he faid to him: God faue thee ô king, God faue thee ô king. ¹⁷ To whom Abfalom: is this, quoth he, thy kindenes toward thy frend? why wenteft thou not with thy frend? 18 And Chufai answered Absalom: Not so: because I wil be his, whom our Lord hath chosen, and all this people, and all Ifrael, and with him wil tarie. 19 Yea that I may adde this also, whom shal I ferue? not the kinges sonne? as I haue ferued thy father, fo wil I ferue thee alfo. ²⁰ And Abfalom faid to Achitophel: Confult what we ought to doe. 21 And Achitophel faid to Abfalom: Goe in to the concubines of thy father, which he hath left to keepe the

house: a)that when al Ifrael shal heare that thou hast defiled thy father, their handes may be strengthened with thee. ²² They pitched therefore a tent for Absalom in the house toppe, and he went in to his fathers concubines before al Ifrael. ²³ And the counsel of Achitophel, which he gaue in those dayes, as if a man should consult God: so was al the counsel of Achitophel, both when he was with Dauid, and when he was with Absalom.

^a The people doubting left Abfalõ might be reconciled to his father, were not affured vnto him til they faw fuch a crime committed as femed to make reconciliatiõ impossible. So al rebelles and vsurpers of others right, seeke by some enormious fact to make their adherentes and folowers sure vnto them: but God plagueth them in the end, as he did both Achitophel and Absalom.
