Chapter 23

The laft wordes of Dauid concerning reward of the good, 6. and punishment of the bad. 8. A catalogue of Dauids valiant men.

nd thefe are Dauides laft wordes. Dauid the fonne of Ifai fayd: The man fayd, to whom it was appointed concerning the Chrift of the God of Iacob, the excellent Pfalmift of Ifrael: ² The Spirit of our Lord hath fpoken by me, and his wordes by my tongue. ³ The God of Ifrael fayd to me, the Strong one of Ifrael hath fpoken, the Dominatour of men, the iuft ruler in the feare of God. ⁴ As the light of the mourning when the funne ryfeth, early without cloudes gliftereth, and as by rayne graffe fpringeth out of the earth. ⁵ a)Neither is my house fo great with God, that he should enter with me an eternal couenant firme in al thinges & affured. For all my faluation, and all my wil: neither is there ought therof that fpringeth not. ⁶ And transgreffors shal be plucked vp as thornes euery one: which are not taken with handes. 7 And if a man wil touch them, he shal be armed with vron and a lance ftaffe, and kindled with fyre they shal be burnt vnto nothing. 8 These be the names of the valiantes of Dauid. Sitting in his chaire the wifeft prince amongeft three, he is as it were the most tender litle worme of the wood, which killed eight hundred at one brunt. 9 After him, Eleazar the fonne of his vncle the Ahohite among the three valiantes, that were with Dauid when they defyed the Philifthijms, and were gathered thither into battel. ¹⁰ And when the men of Ifrael were gone vp, he ftood and ftroke the Philiftians til his hand faynted. and waxed ftiffe with the fword: and our Lord made a

great victorie that day: and the people, that was fled, returned to take away of the spoyles of them that were flayne. 11 And after him Semma the fonne of Age of Arari. And the Philifthijms were gathered together in their ward: for there was there a filde ful of rice. And when the people was fled from the face of the Philifthijms, 12 he ftood in the middes of the filde, and defended it, and ftroke the Philifthians: and our Lord gaue great faluation. 13 Moreouer also before there went downe three which were princes among thirtie, and came to Dauid in the haruest time into the caue of Odollam: and the campe of the Philiftianes was placed in the Vale of the giantes. 14 And Dauid was in a hold: moreouer the ward of the Philifthianes was then in Bethlehem. 15 Dauid a)therfore defyred, & fayd: O that fome man would geue me drinke of the water out of the cefterne, that is in Bethlehem befide the gate. ¹⁶ Three valiantes therfore brake into the campe of the Philiftianes, and drew water out of the cefterne of Bethlehem, that was befide the gate, and brought it to Dauid: but he would not drinke, but b)offered it to our Lord, 17 faying: Our Lord be merciful to me, that I doe not this thing: fhal I drinke the bloud of these men that went, & the peril of their liues? Therfore he would no drinke. Thefe thinges did the three ftrongest. ¹⁸ Abifai also the brother of Ioab the fonne of Saruia, was prince of three, it is he that lifted vp his fpeare agaynft three hundred, whom he flewe, renowmed among three, 19 and the nobleft of three, and he was the chiefe of them, but to the three first he raught not. ²⁰ And Banaias the sonne of Ioiada the most valiant man of great workes, of Cabsel: he ftroke the two lions of Moab, and he went downe, and ftroke the lyon in the middes of the cefterne in the dayes of fnow. 21 He also stroke the Ægyptian, a man worthie to be a fpectacle, having in his hand a fpeare: therfore when he came downe to him with a rod, by force

he wrested the speare out of the hand of the Ægyptian, and flewe him with his owne fpeare. 22 Thefe thinges did Banaias the fonne of Ioiada. 23 And he renowmed among the three valiantes, which were the nobler among thirtie: but vnto the three he raught not: and Dauid made him of his fecrete counsel. ²⁴ Afael the brother of Ioab among the thirtie, Elahanan the fonne of his vncle of Bethlehem. ²⁵ Semma of Harodi, Elica of Harori, ²⁶ Heles of Phalti, Hira the fonne of Acces of Thecua, ²⁷ Abiezer of Anathoth, Mobonnai of Hufati, ²⁸ Selmon the Ahohite, Maharai the Netophathite, ²⁹ Heled the fonne of Baana, he alfo a Netophathite, Ithai the fonne of Ribai of Gabaath of the children of Benjamin, 30 Banaia the Pharathonite, Heddai of the Torrent Gaas, 31 Abialbon the Arbathite, Azmaueth of Beromi, 32 Eliaba of Salaboni: The fonnes of Iaffen, Ionathan, ³³ Semma of Orori, Ahiam the fonne of Sarar the Ararite, ³⁴ Eliphelet the fonne of Aafbai the fonne of Machati, Eliam the fonne of Achitophel the Gelonite, ³⁵ Hefrai of Carmel, Pharai of Arbi, ³⁶ Igaal the fonne of Nathan of Soba, Bonni of Gadi, ³⁷ Selec of Ammoni, Naharai the Berothite the fquyer of Ioab the fonne of Saruia, 38 Ira the Iethrite, Gareb he also a Iethrite, ³⁹ Vrias the Hetheite.
